#### **Oregon Sustainable School Awards**

The Oregon Department of Education and Sustainable Oregon Schools Initiative are accepting applications from schools and districts for the Oregon Sustainable School Awards. Applicants are also evaluated for nomination to the U.S. Department of Education 2015 Green Ribbon recognition program. This Award recognizes schools for their great work to 1) address environmental impacts, 2) provide for healthy, safe students and staff, 3) educate for environmental and social literacy, and 4) contribute to community sustainability.

Mary Rellergert Forestry Education Award

This award is designed to recognize significant contributions to the advancement of public information, education, and understanding of forestry.

Environmental Professional Development for K-12

Open application online Due January 15th, 2015 Awarded in May

Outdoor School Programs for 5th and/or 6th graders Open online April 15th, 2015 Due June 15th, 2015 Awarded in September

Community Field Trips for 5th through 8th graders Open online May 15th, 2015 Due July 15th, 2015 Awarded in October

GFF makes grants to schools, government agencies, and nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations. Approximately \$750,000 will be available for the 2015 grant cycle. The average grant size is \$13,500.
