"Outdoor School for All" Bill Passed by Legislature!

Congratulations!

On Thursday, July 2nd theOregon State House of Representatives unanimously passed SB 439 with a vote of59-0, establishing for the first time a state commitment to outdoor school programs. The legislation had passed the Senate earlier in the week with only one no vote.



While there is no funding associated with SB 439, it is an important first step. It gives the Oregon State University (OSU) Extension Service theresponsibility to develop model Outdoor School curriculum consistent with statewide education requirements as funding becomes available. Under the bill, OSUExtension Service will work with an advisory committee made up of educators, outdoor school providers, community members and others from across the state.

Outdoor School Research Released

TheGray Family Foundation recently supported research in partnership with PSU andMESD, studying a few important outcomes of students attending Outdoor Schoolprograms. This unique study looked at statistically significant quantitativedata from 17,032 students in four



different school districts, all of whomparticipate in Outdoor School programming through the Multnomah EducationalService District. Theresearch found that residential, field-based science programs have a unique opportunity osupport students by creating experiences where they can participate inlearning in vastly different ways from what they may engage with in the traditional4-walled classroom, while concurrently developing a relationship with thenatural world.
