As outdoor school programming wraps up in schools across the state for 2017, I am pleased to share with you the full report from a study, completed by researcher David Keyes, Ph.D., on Outdoor School in Oregon. As Oregon launches the first in the nation statewide outdoor school program, we sought an assessment of the current state of this long running program prior to school districts have access to dedicated state funding. This report provides an in-depth look at current participation, the length of programs, and some of the barriers, as well as benefits to students. Dr. Keyes uses a mix of quantitative and qualitative data. This mix-method approach gives us a broad and deep understanding of the current state of Outdoor School in Oregon by identifying both the who, what, where and when of Outdoor School, as well as the how and why. Launch Your Project with a Partners in Conservation Grant

Get the funding you need to launch your conservation project. East Multnomah Soil and

Watershed Council's annual grant cycle for the 2018 Partners in Conservation (PIC) grants program is coming up. **Applications are due by 4pm on Thursday, December 15th this year.**

In order to be eligible for funding, projects or events must be located within the District service area (all Multnomah County east of the Willamette River) or serve its residents. Projects must show a clear public benefit in one or more of the following: habitat restoration or watershed health, soil erosion prevention/control, soil health, water quality, water conservation, and/or environmental education.
