YEAR ONE: OUTDOOR SCHOOL BY THE NUMBERS

- ➤ \$8.8 million in approved funding
- ➤ 121 school districts funded
- Number of students who will attend: 36,404
 That's 75% of eligible students
- ➤ Total number of days students will get outside: 136,465
- ➤ Funding awarded to districts in all **36** counties
- ➤ 82 new schools attending Outdoor School for the first time
 That's 7,137 new students
