OAESD Summer Learning Grant Program

The Oregon State Legislature committed an additional \$50 million for summer learning programs provided to community-based organizations across the state through grants administered by the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts (OAESD). The focus of these grants is to prioritize those students experiencing disabilities and other student communities who have been historically underserved. These funds are designed to continue the equity work started in 2021 and to continue to mitigate the impacts of the pandemic on those student communities most affected.
